

### FROM THE MINISTER'S DESK



The famous nineteenth century preacher Charles Spurgeon had the habit of saying to himself several times, as he approached the pulpit to preach, 'I believe in the Holy Spirit.' By saying this he was drawing himself out of the situation and asking God to bless and communicate through what was about to happen. How wise, for no one goes into church to hear the musing of the minister, rather they want to hear the Word of God.

Preaching should not be about the collusion of minister and congregation in the reinforcement of cosy assumptions. Rather, the Word of God, comes to us fresh and clear. If the preacher gives little attention to the text, then not a lot may happen. If the congregational members neither read nor listen to the passage, and then disengage from the sermon, how can they lifted or challenged?

We in Kilmore and Oban have been blessed in the new NRSV Bibles in our pews, and many people have purchased their own copies. We are hearing the word read in new phrases, without the now jarring non-inclusive language. A rota of readers gives us a variety of accents and speech patterns to alert us to the text. Both ministers seek to be faithful in our preaching to the text, and seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit to proclaim the Living Christ.

May we be excited as God's word comes to us each Sunday, and acknowledge how privileged we are to be free to listen, and then act, as disciples.

# SHARING FAITH PROFILE RACHAEL TURNBULL



# How did you find your way into the congregation of Kilmore and Oban?

I live nearby and just wanted to see if it was for me. I was raised in faith and always kept my faith, but hadn't found the right place to practice. The welcoming ethos and the people I met and friends I have made kept me coming back.

#### Why is your faith important to you?

I find it to be a source of comfort and guidance. I can't really explain it well, I need it.

### What excites you about being part of the Church?

The church has such a warm welcoming feel to it, I like being part of that. I like helping where I can with Family Faithshare.

#### Do you have a favourite piece of music and/or hymn, reading?

Usually when I'm looking at the hymns before the service I see ones and think 'ooh I like that one'. I like the upbeat ones.

#### Tell us about your working life.

I'm the manager of a nursery and have been there for about 14 years. I was depute for 5 years and I've been manager for 4 years. I love my job and feel very lucky to have the role I do and to be able to help and support our families wherever we can.

#### How do you relax?

I can't believe I'm writing this, but I go to the gym 3 times a week, do park run on a Saturday and trail walk at the weekend too. All just in the last year, as I had a very sedentary lifestyle before, but it was time to make a change.

#### What is your favourite food, place, book, movie?

The Harry Potter series for movies and books. Blackpool is my favourite place and we go there 3 or 4 times a year- every year. My favourite food? I like cake!

# Is there someone who has been a real inspiration in faith, and if so, why?

My mum and my aunt - strong faith and strong ladies.

That more people are open to the possibility of faith, that we no longer have to defend why we have faith and that people just accept it's because we do, and we don't need to explain why.
